Visit highlighted benefits of eco-friendly e-waste recycling, challenges facing e-waste recyclers

August 16, 2016 – [Rep. Ed Royce \(R-CA\)](#), Chairman of the House Foreign Affairs Committee, recently toured Extreme Recycling, an e-waste recycler headquartered in Placentia, California and member of the [Coalition for American Electronics Recycling \(CAER\)](#). The August 11 event provided Chairman Royce the opportunity to learn more about the benefits of eco-friendly e-waste recycling and the challenges facing e-waste recyclers.

The House Foreign Affairs Committee oversees the Export Administration Act (EAA), the body that regulates the export of e-waste. Legislation impacting the export of e-waste to foreign nations, the [Secure Electronics Export and Recycling Act](#) (SEERA – HR 5579), is currently under consideration in the Committee. HR 5579 was [recently introduced](#) by Rep. Paul Cook (R-CA) and Rep. Gene Green (D-TX).
